



BURN RESTRICTION GUIDE



ALLOWED

OUTDOOR COOKING



Outdoor BBQ grills that are fueled by wood, pellets, charcoal, and/or liquid propane gas, natural gas, or liquid fuel.

OUTDOOR FIREPLACES/APPLIANCES



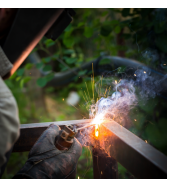
Any outdoor fire contained in a portable or fixed fireplace or appliance. A spark arrestor (a device that prevents the emissions of flammable debris) must be used when burning wood, pellets, or charcoal.

OUTDOOR SMOKING



Outdoor smoking in designated areas only. NOT ALLOWED IN CITY OWNED PARKS AND OPEN SPACES.

MAY BE ALLOWED WITH PERMIT



Hot work activities, such as welding in forested or grassy areas.



Model rocket launching.

ONLY SELECT PROFESSIONAL FIREWORKS DISPLAYS MAY BE ALLOWED

AFTER AN APPROVED REVIEW, INSPECTION, AND PERMIT IS ISSUED BY CSFD.

NOT ALLOWED

RECREATIONAL FIRES



Any outdoor fire or campfire where the fire is not contained in a portable or fixed fireplace or appliance. No permits will be issued for bonfires.

SMALL ENGINE EQUIPMENT



Operating small internal combustion engines such as chainsaws, WITHOUT a properly installed, maintained, and functioning spark arrestor.

OUTDOOR SMOKING



NO outdoor smoking in ALL CITY OWNED PARKS AND OPEN SPACES.

PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES



Use of recreational fireworks requiring ignition (has a fuse); sparklers, rockets, fountains, smoke bombs, etc.



Any type of fire, whether open or contained, on any undeveloped wildland areas, brushy areas, or grassy areas.



Burning of trash, rubbish, yard waste, or construction material.
